Update about the *International*Turfgrass Research Society Journal

The review and publication process for ITRSJ Volume 15 is progressing steadily. We have a total of 214 submissions associated with the conference that are either published or in final review stages across various categories, including 126 Full Research Papers (79 in ITSRJ, 37 in Crop Science, and 10 in Agronomy Journal), 7 Case Studies, 2 Issue Papers, 46 Short Communications, and 33 Technical Reports.

Thank you to the authors for their patience as we work to get all of these manuscripts across the finish line. Our editorial team is working hard to process the manuscripts that are awaiting a final decision. We appreciate the dedication of our authors and reviewers in contributing to this conference and look forward to sharing the latest advancements in turfgrass science in Japan this summer! EGA Strengthens Role in EU Pesticide Policy Dialogue

The European Golf Association (EGA) continues to closely monitor EU regulations on pesticide use and, since 2022, has been actively engaged in dialogue with the European Commission to ensure that golf is recognised as a credible stakeholder in future policy discussions.

In March 2025, EGA representatives met with officials from DG SANTE (Directorate-General for Health and Food Safety) to highlight the social, environmental, and economic value of golf and to promote sustainable turfgrass management practices. Although the proposed Sustainable Use Regulation (SUR) — which would have banned pesticide use in sensitive areas — was withdrawn in 2024, the Sustainable Use of Pesticides Directive (SUD) remains in force. This directive continues to mandate further reductions in the use of chemical pesticides, including on golf courses.

The Commission has confirmed that EGA will be involved in the upcoming implementation dialogue

involved in the upcoming implementation dialogue on the SUD, expected to begin in late 2025. Two key topics have emerged: the acceleration of the authorisation process for biopesticides as alternatives to traditional chemicals, and the legal requirement, starting in 2026, for digital recording of pesticide use.

To support these efforts, the EGA has called on national golf federations to engage with their respective national authorities to:

 Communicate the golf sector's efforts to reduce pestcide use;

- Represent the specific needs of golf at the national level:
- Explore alternative solutions such as biopesticides;
- Prepare for the upcoming requirement of digital pesticide use tracking.

These actions aim to position golf as a proactive partner in the transition toward sustainable land and turfgrass management practices across Europe.

11th International Symposium of Grass Microbial Endophytes (ISGME2025)

The 11th International Symposium of Grass Microbial Endophytes (ISGME2025) will be held November 11-13, 2025 in Hamilton, New Zealand. Visit the symposium website for information: https://isgme2025.com/

Theme: Grass endophytic microbes for sustainable agricultural production

ISGME, previously known as the International Symposium of Fungal Endophytes of Grasses (ISFEG), is an international symposium held every 3-4 years. The 11th symposium is to be held with the New Zealand Grassland Association (NZGA) Annual Conference and will continue the legacy of previous ISFEG symposia on fungal endophytes of forage grasses.

Grasses play a critical role in global food production and ecosystems, from pastures for grazing livestock, to turf uses and grain production for animal and human consumption. This symposium will promote the latest scientific advances in the ecology and agricultural application of microbes that form beneficial associations with grasses.

ISGME2025 will attract researchers from around the world who are focused on the basic and applied aspects of using endophytic microorganisms, including but not exclusively Epichloë fungi, as promising solutions for sustainable agricultural production, with a focus on both temperate (C3) and tropical (C4) grasses, including pastures and cereals.

Symposium themes:

- 1. Occurrence, diversity and ecology of grass microbial (fungal and bacterial) endophytes
- 2. Mechanistic understanding of host-endophyte interactions
- 3. Involvement of multitrophic and microbiome interactions
- 4. Practical application of endophytes for plant protection and production

In conjunction with NZGA Annual Conference:

The New Zealand Grassland Association (NZGA) has a vision of "fuelled by science, tempered by experience" and provides a forum for grassland farming and promotes the value of research and its application. Its members come from a wide range of researchers, consultants,

agribusiness and farmers. The annual conference provides a collegial atmosphere, field trips, ready access to current grassland science, best farm practice, and publishes the peer-reviewed Journal of New Zealand Grasslands

ISGME2025 and NZGA will run concurrent sessions. Registration at ISGME2025 will automatically give participants the added option of attending any session at the annual conference of NZGA and broadening their networks during the shared breaks and field trips.

Bill enjoyed a long career in Soil Science at the University of Wales, Aberystwyth between 1965 until his retirement as Professor Emeritus in the mid-2000's. Bill was presented with many awards for his work including a 1994 Friendship Award from the Peoples Republic of China for cooperation in teaching and research and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Institute of Groundsmanship in 1999.

Away from work Bill was a devoted family man, keen gardener and small-holder and enthusiast of motor sports, who will be sadly missed.

The world of turfgrass mourns the passing of Teri Yamada, a former Board member and key figure in Canadian golf, who passed away on January 8, 2025, after a battle with Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease. Yamada contributed nearly 40 years to the golf industry, including significant roles at Golf Canada and as a leader in environmental and agronomic research. She played a key role in shaping golf course operations and environmental strategies, and also served on numerous boards and committees in both Canadian and international golf organizations, including the International Turfgrass Society, where Teri served as a Program Director for the 2001 ITRC meeting. Beyond her professional achievements, Yamada was a passionate golfer and active volunteer, deeply respected for her expertise, work ethic, and generosity.
